Litigation & Dispute Resolution

In addition to litigation, the group has significant experience in mediation and arbitration, and it regularly advises businesses on regulatory changes and litigation risk management.

Our principals are hands on and work closely with clients throughout the process. We have deep experience working with Chinese clients locally and abroad with dedicated members of the team speaking Mandarin and Cantonese. This allows clients to gain legal advice from our most senior and most experienced practitioners in their native language.

The group's knowledge and experience span a wide range of jurisdictions and industries including government, manufacturing, energy, retail, property, insurance, finance and agriculture.

- Acting for Shanghai-based investors in relation to investigations into alleged fraudulent conduct and misrepresentation by the fund manager, the director, and the shadow director of the trustee company. The matter involves issues concerning breaches of fiduciary duties, regulatory obligations, and deceptive conduct that may have misled investors. Successfully obtained judgment in our clients' favour in excess AUD 10 million plus compound interest: Chu v Lin, in the matter of Gold Stone Capital Pty Ltd [2024] FCA 766.
- Successfully obtained freezing orders against judgment debtors, including in circumstances where the defendant transferred ownership of his sole real property asset to his wife after judgment was delivered: Chu v Lin (No 5) [2024] FCA 1034.
- Successfully set aside Registrar's decisions granting extensions of time to comply with bankruptcy notices, with priority costs orders made in favour of our client to be paid from the bankrupt estate: Darmali v Chu [2025] FedCFamC2G 1081.
- Acting for a client in proceedings involving the diversion of business opportunities by his business partners to competing entities under their control. The case involves allegations that the fiduciaries knowingly misused their positions to advance their own interests, including by diverting projects, misappropriating trust funds, and failing to disclose conflicts of interest, conduct alleged to be dishonest and in breach of duties under the Corporations Act and equitable principles: Firmtech Aluminium Pty Ltd v Xie; Zhang v Xu; Xie v Auschn Conveyancing & Associates Pty Ltd [2024] NSWSC 1293.
- Acting for one of the largest Chinese solar energy equipment suppliers in various matters, including debt recovery, enforcement of payment obligations for the supply of solar panels, and disputes regarding set-off liabilities arising from allegedly defective products.
